Venue

How to reach the venue?

We discourage coming to Brussels by car as the location is well served by public transport (bus, metro and train).

- By train: Brussels, Central station. It takes about 10 minutes to walk from the Central Station to the venue. Alternatively, you can take the metro.
- By metro: Subway station Trône/Troon
 From Central Station: line 1 to Art-Loi/Kunst-Wet and there line 2.

 From North Station: tramway to Rogier and there line 2.
 From South Station: line 2
- By car: Follow the inner ringroads clockwise towards rue de la Loi/Wetstraat, then take the side-road of Boulevard du Régent/ Regentlaan to the venue. There are paying parking spaces in the immediate vicinity of the venue (payment to be renewed every 2 hours). It is advised to park in the underground car park 'Albertine' (16 Place de la Justice). From there it is a 10 minute walk to the venue.

Language

The official language is English.

There is no simultaneous translation.
